

Enochs High School maintains a comprehensive counseling program that offers a variety of support system for students as they progress through high school.

- Enoch's has a well trained counseling staff that is prepared to monitor academic progress toward meeting graduation requirements. **Counselors** also provide students with support for their academic, personal and social needs.
- Within the counseling department, there is an **EL Counselor** who is adept at meeting the English Learners by providing classroom presentations, meetings with parents, and education regarding re-classification criteria.
- Enoch's High School also maintains a **College and Scholarship Counselor** who assists students with college applications, letters of recommendation, and information regarding college entrance exams, financial aid, and scholarships. The college counselor provides classroom presentations and individual appointments for parents and students.
- Parents are encouraged to keep apprised of their student's progress in classes. **PowerSchool** is an online tool parents and students can use to monitor grades and attendance. - Counselors make classroom visits during the school year for the purpose of **4-year planning and balloting**. During the presentations, counselors review graduation requirements and each student's transcript, with a focus on meeting post secondary college and career goals.
- **After school homework help/tutoring** is available to students who need extra assistance in classes. After school homework help/tutoring is free of charge and is available 4 days per week with a credentialed teacher.
- **CASHEE remediation classes** are available to assist students in preparing for this graduation requirements. Students must see their counselor to enroll in CAHSEE review classes during 0 period.
- **Parent conferences** are always available as a support for students and their parents. In addition to meetings with teachers, parents have the opportunity to meet with a counselor at any time to review their student's progress toward meeting the graduation requirements or other concerns they may have.
- Students who are struggling academically are often referred to the **Student Success Team (SST)**. The team consists of an administrator, teachers, school psychologist, counselor, school nurse, special education teacher, parent and student. The purpose of meeting with the team is to review the student's

educational history, identify the student's strengths and weaknesses, and develop strategies for success.

- Students who qualify for a **504 plan** or an **IEP** are also provided with an annual meeting to review academic progress, determine educational goals, review modifications and accommodations in education, and ensure that students are educated in the least restrictive environment possible.
