

Dress Code

Students may be referred to the administration for inappropriate dress using the Davis High School student referral form.

The site specific dress code was discussed at the Safety committee meeting on September 27, 2010. The Committee unanimously approved the items listed below. The site specific dress code currently in place is as follows:

- No solid red/blue items of clothing or headbands and only one article with some red/blue (all shades)
- No red or blue gloves
- No jewelry including threaded, knotted or crocheted/braided rosaries, dog tags, cut-out buckles, etc., with or without monikers that affiliate a student with gangs
- No item of clothing which depict violence or gang related activities or area codes
- No item of clothing that is directional such as North or South (e.g. So-Cal, No-Cal, Nor-Cal, No-Calie, South Pole, Northern Star)
- No gang symbols to be worn on the body, including tattoos or possessions of a student, including binder and backpack, examples, "13" "14" "XIV" and Huelga Bird
- No red or blue shoe laces (all shades)
- No web belts
- No bandanas
- No bedroom or house slippers with or without rubber soles
- No Nike Cortez shoes or look alike that have red or blue accents
- No solid white oversized T-shirts that go past the fingertips of person wearing the shirt
- No long white socks worn with long shorts that fall below the knee
- No "Skins" apparel, logos, or Jugalos apparel
- No baggie or oversized Ben Davis or Dickies pants

A. STUDENT CONDUCT CODES, K-6 AND 7-12:

Any dress, grooming, or appearance, which disrupts, or tends to disrupt the educational process, or affect the health or safety of individuals, shall be prohibited (Educational Code 48900, sub-section k; 35161, 35183, 35291.5, 35294.1; C.A.C Title V, Section 302; and Board Policy 5135, 5135.1, and 5137).

- Any attire/paraphernalia/symbol that signifies gang affiliation will not be allowed on campus.
- Any attire/paraphernalia/symbol that displays a logo or other message promoting alcohol or controlled substances, promoting violence, illegal activity, or relating to gangs may not be worn on campus.

B. SUPERINTENDENT'S DIRECTIVE THAT COMPLIES WITH BOARD POLICY 5135 RELATED TO GANG ACTIVITY:

Student may not wear or possess hats, caps, or other headgear during school hours at school sites except as specifically authorized by a school official for such activities and theatrical performances or other approved personal reasons such as health needs. During inclement weather, K-6 students may wear protective head coverings other than bill caps such as: sweatshirt/jacket hoods, knit caps, scarves, earmuffs, etc.

C. PROHIBITED "GANG-RELATED" APPAREL (Adopted by the School Safety Committee, September 27, 2010)

1. No Solid Red or Blue Clothing
2. Belt Buckles (Initials)
3. Ben Davis Attire
4. Large Wallet Chains
5. Red or Blue shoe laces

D. CONSEQUENCES ARE:

1st Offense Warning to student. Notification of parent. Student may be sent home to dress properly, if necessary.

2nd Offense 1-day suspension (K-6) / 3-day suspension (7-12).

3rd Offense 3-day suspension (K-6) / 5-day suspension (7-12) and possible recommendation for alternative education program.
